The use of the gangways should be kept to a minimum, work should be organised so as to reduce movement around the venue where possible. 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Providing Learning opportunities.	Musicians, Tutors, Participants/Learners, Audience Members and The Globe Staff/Volunteers. Covid-19 cross contamination	Prior to any learning session, Globe staff and tutors must ensure that COVID 19 signage / sanitising equipment is in place in the room to be used for the session, routes around the building and ancillary rooms such as toilets. Covid-19 cross contamination via musical instruments/equip ment provided by the Globe	Musicians, Tutors, Participants/Learners, Audience Members and The Globe Staff/Volunteers. Covid-19 cross contamination	Globe staff and tutors must ensure that that all equipment provided by the Globe (including instruments, music stands, microphones, sound equipment, etc) is sanitised before the start of a session and at the end of the session. After handling Globe equipment, staff should wash/sanitise hands irrespective of your next task.	On-going vigilance	Tutors, Globe Staff/volunteers	Immediately	ТА
Covid-19 Cross Contamination in High Traffic	Musicians, Tutors, Participants/Learners, Audience Members and	On a regular basis high traffic areas where transference could occur should be cleaned.	On-going vigilance	Tutors, Globe Staff/volunteers	Immediately	TA

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Touch Areas including toilets	The Globe Staff/Volunteers. Covid-19 cross contamination	This includes door presses, handrails and switches.  Globe staff should ensure that hand washing and drying facilities and hand sanitiser are available in all toilet/washroom facilities. Tutors should ensure that learners/participants are aware of the restrictions placed on numbers in toilets at any time.				
Covid-19 cross contamination between musicians and learners	Musicians, Tutors, Participants/Learners, Audience Members and The Globe Staff/Volunteers. Covid-19 cross contamination	Be vigilant in assisting all to enjoy themselves safely in line with social distancing guidelines.  A social distance of 2m is advised. However UK government guidance allows for a 1m+ distance with mitigation where 2m is not possible.	On-going vigilance  Tutors should consider the use of screens between learners who are playing woodwind, brass or other blown instruments or singers and other participants to reduce the possibility of aerosol transmission. 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		Particular attention should be paid to woodwind, brass and all other blown instruments (e.g. flute, clarinet, saxophone, trumpet, etc.) and singers – government guidance suggests a social distance of 3 metres and/or screens between learners who fall into these categories Under no circumstances should instruments be shared.  In all contact situations irrespective of distance staff, tutors and learners should consider side-to-side or back-to-back working or passing by.	Tutors should ensure that participants maintain social distancing during the session.			

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Provision of hospitality e.g. liquid refreshments. Covid-19 cross contamination between staff/tutors and learners particpants	Musicians, Tutors, Participants/Learners, Audience Members and The Globe Staff/Volunteers	The bar will be closed to comply with government regulations.
